## Minimum Age & Interval for Valid Vaccine Doses

| Hepatitis B<br>HepB                              | Dose 1 | Birth  | 4 weeks between Dose 1 & 2<br>(K-12 <sup>th</sup> )   | <input type="checkbox"/> 2 doses valid if adult Recombivax HB® given between ages 11 and 15 and doses separated by at least 4 months.   |
|  | Dose 2 | 4 weeks  | 8 weeks between Dose 2 & 3<br>(K-12 <sup>th</sup> )   |   |
|  | Dose 3 | 24 weeks<br>4 months                           | 16 weeks between Dose 1 & 3<br>(K-9 <sup>th</sup> )<br>12 weeks between Dose 1 & 3<br>(10 <sup>th</sup> -12 <sup>th</sup> ) |   |
| Diphtheria, Tetanus,<br>and Pertussis<br>DTaP/DT | Dose 1 | 6 weeks  | 4 weeks between Dose 1 & 2  | <input type="checkbox"/> DTaP: for children through age 6.<br><input type="checkbox"/> 6 month interval is recommended between Dose 3 and Dose 4, but minimum interval of 4 months is acceptable.<br><input type="checkbox"/> Students 7-10 years of age not fully immunized with DTaP should get one Tdap followed by additional doses of Td if needed.<br><input type="checkbox"/> DTaP given after age 7 counts for the Tdap dose; no Tdap required at 11-12 years of age.                         |

| Tetanus, Diphtheria,<br>and Pertussis<br>Tdap    | Dose 1 | 10 years recommended. See notes for exceptions | –   | <input type="checkbox"/> Tdap: for children 7 years of age or older.<br><input type="checkbox"/> If no DTaP doses given before age 7, students must get Tdap followed by 2 doses of Td.<br><input type="checkbox"/> Tdap given between 7-10 years of age is valid and meets the requirement.<br><input type="checkbox"/> Can be given regardless of the interval between DTaP or Td.  |
| Tetanus and<br>Diphtheria<br>Td                  | Dose 1 | 7 years  | 5 years   | <input type="checkbox"/> Td: for children 7 years of age or older.  |

|  | Dose 3 | 14 weeks                                       | 6 months between Dose 3 & 4   |   |

| Measles, Mumps,<br>and Rubella<br>MMR            | Dose 1 | 12 months                                      | 4 weeks between Dose 1 & 2  | <input type="checkbox"/> MMRV (MMR+ varicella) may be used instead of separate MMR and varicella vaccines.<br><input type="checkbox"/> Must get the same day as VAR <u>OR</u> at least 28 days apart.<br><input type="checkbox"/> 4-day grace <u>DOES</u> apply between doses of the same live vaccine such as MMR and MMR. The 4 day grace period <u>DOES NOT</u> apply between Dose 1 and Dose 2 of different live vaccines, such as between MMR and Varicella or between MMR and live flu vaccine. |
|  | Dose 2 | 13 months                                      | –   |   |
| Varicella<br>(chickenpox)<br>VAR                 | Dose 1 | 12 months                                      | 3 months between Dose 1 & 2<br>(12 months through 12 years)<br>4 weeks between Dose 1 & 2<br>(13 years and older)           | <input type="checkbox"/> Recommended: 3 months between varicella doses, but minimum interval of 28 days acceptable. Minimum age of 13 months also acceptable.<br><input type="checkbox"/> Must get the same day as MMR <u>OR</u> at least 28 days apart.<br><input type="checkbox"/> 4-day grace <u>DOES</u> apply between doses of the same live vaccine; <u>DOES NOT</u> apply between doses of different live vaccines.  |
