Significant numbers of students fail classes, predominantly during their freshman and sophomore year, which we believe has led to a decline in graduation rates over the past 5 years.

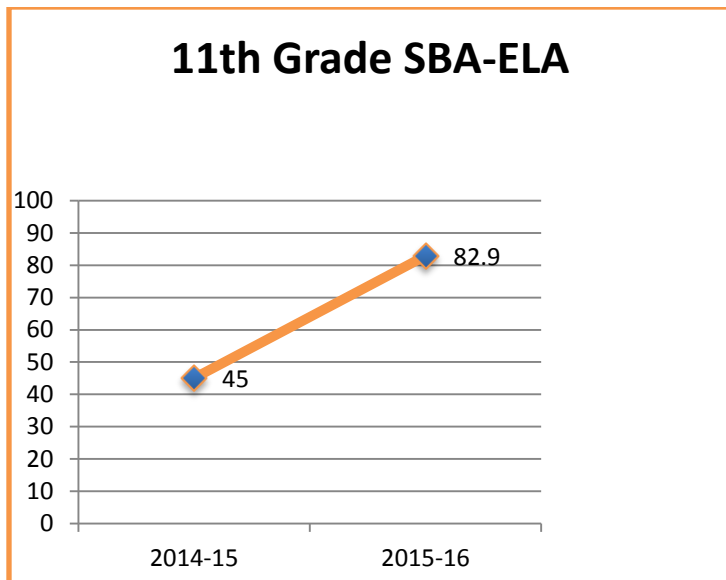
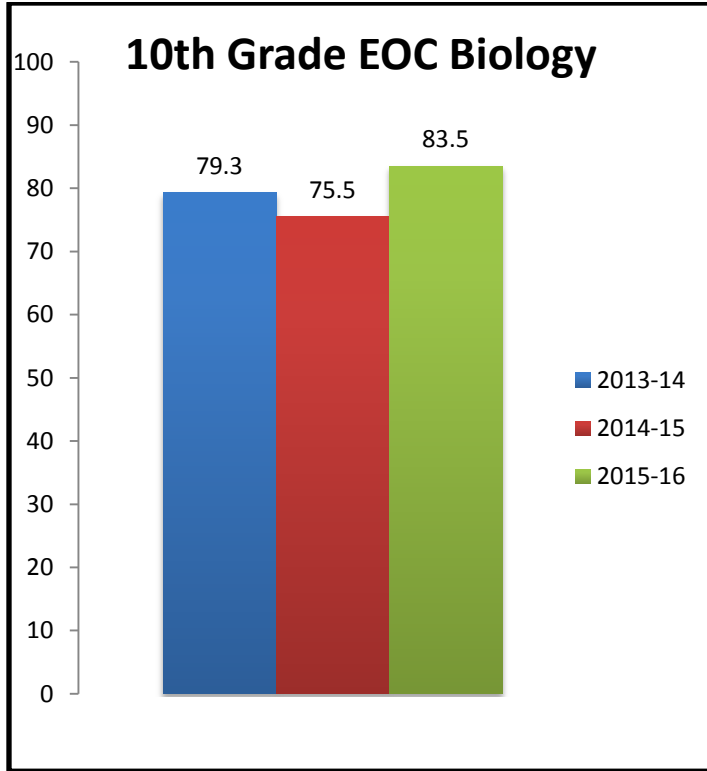

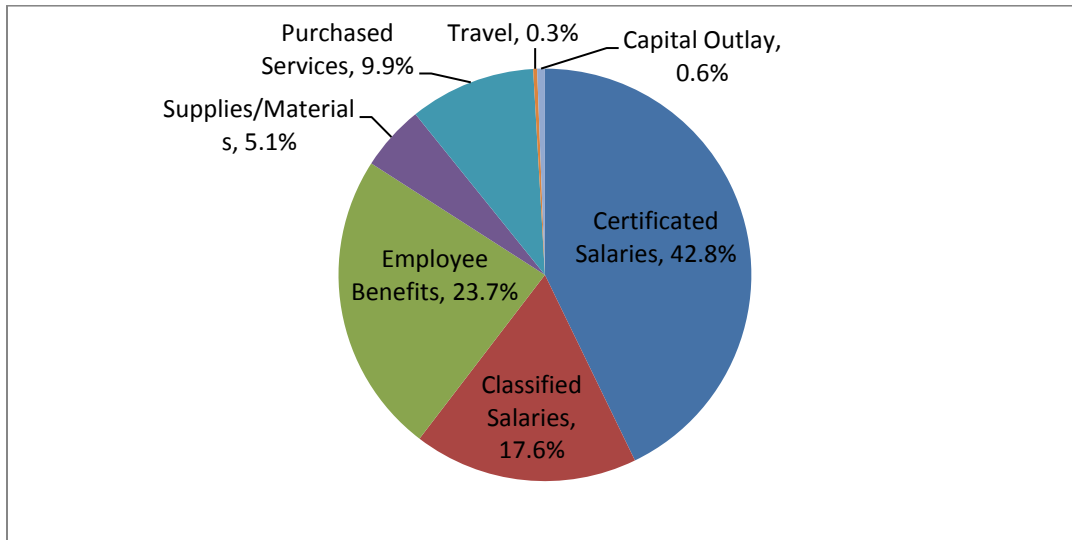
