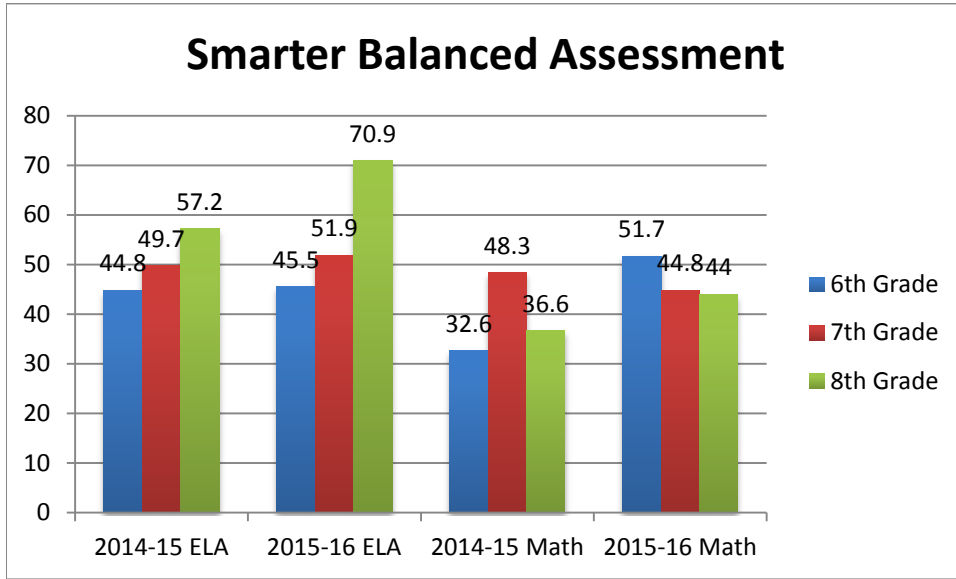

Baseline Data

- Economically disadvantaged students who enter middle school with skill deficits, are not making significant enough extra gains in order to meet the state standards by the time they complete 8th grade.
- Skill deficits are evident in math and reading as demonstrated on STAR, Smarter Balanced, and Agile Mind assessments, as well as teacher and administrator observations.

Student Growth Goal for BMS

Students who are economically disadvantaged will increase their reading and math achievement scores by increasing one level to the next as measured by the STAR assessment and 5% from the September of 2016 to June of 2017 as measured by the SBA in literacy and math.

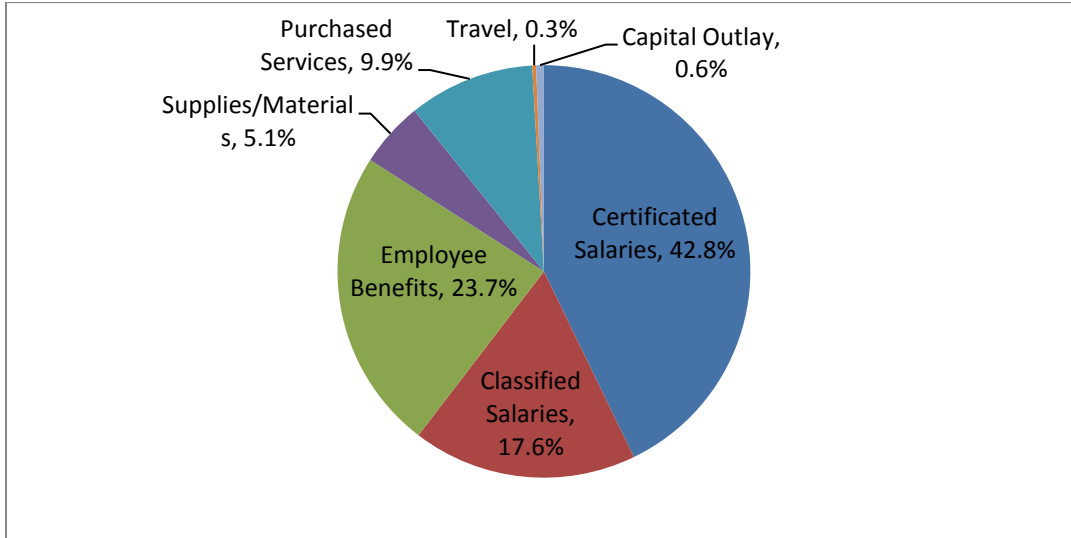
Invitation to Parents
