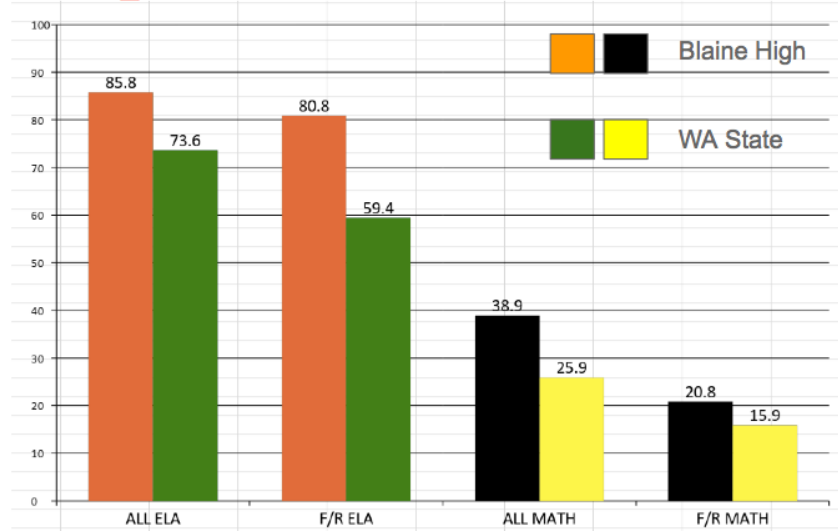
Baseline Data

Determining Our Area of Focus: Achievement Gap for Low Income Students

Conclusions:

- While BHS is above the state average in math, a significant percentage of students are not meeting standard.
- There is a significant gap in achievement between all students and student living in poverty at BHS.

Student Growth Goal for BHS

Long Range Goal: 90% Graduation Rate for current freshman cohort (86% on time, 90% Year 5).

Whole School

Create a culture and environment where kids feel safe at school and enjoy school. Additionally by April 2018, students will increase rates of math performance from 38.9% to 50% on the 11th grade SBA and increase the percent of students meeting standard in ELA by 3-5% based on STAR and SBA.

Achievement GAP

By April 2018, we will narrow the achievement gap in math of children living in poverty from 18% to 8% as measured by SBA, as well as increase the graduation rate of students with disabilities to 100%.

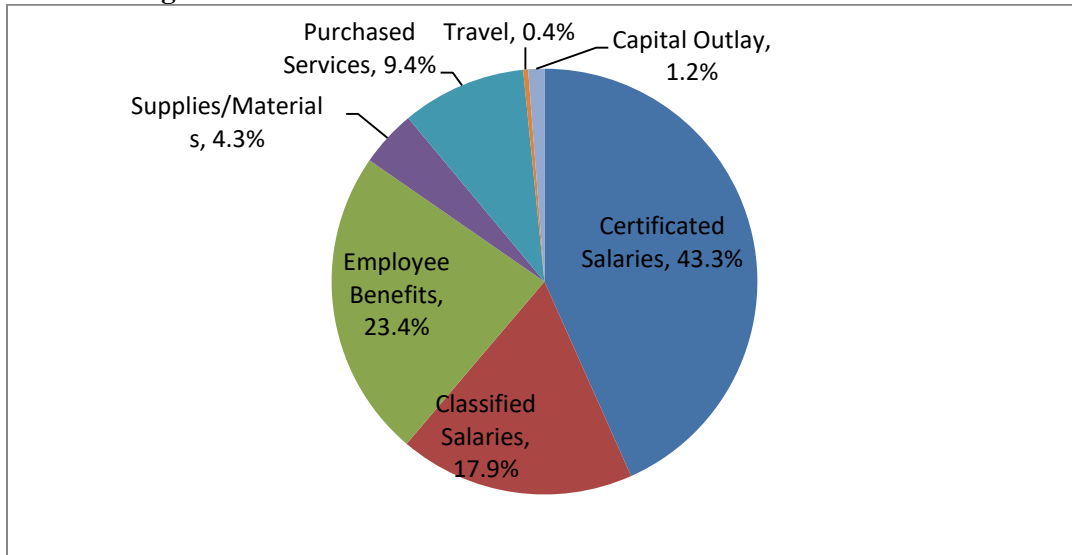
Select Classes Student Growth

English teachers will identify a sub group of students below standard. Students in this sub group will make additional growth relative to peers (8%) based on STAR, SBA, and conferring data in order to close the achievement gap.
