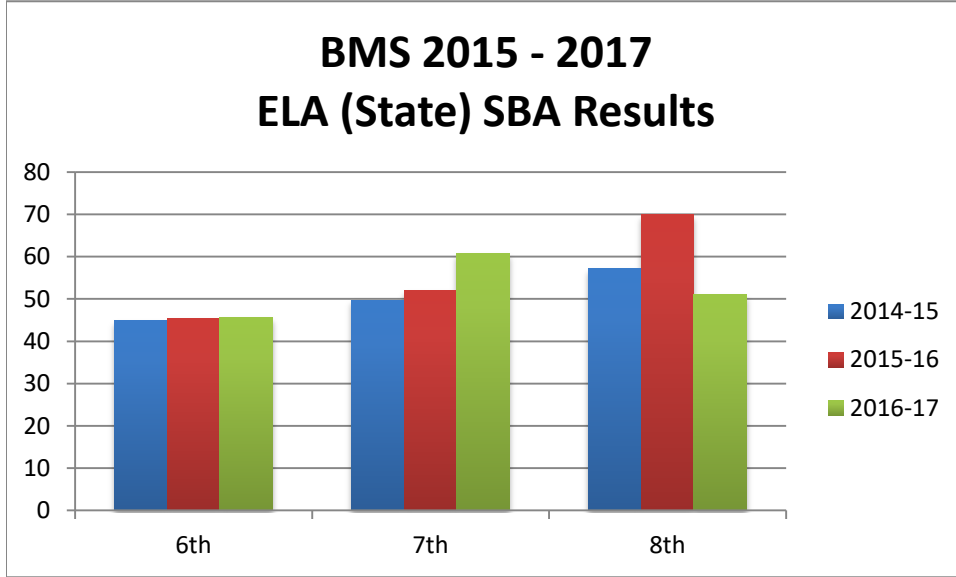

Student Growth Goal for BMS

Whole School

By Spring 2018, percent of BMS students meeting standard in ELA will grow by 5% based on SBA & STAR.

Achievement Gap

By Spring 2018, percentage of BMS students on free and reduced lunch meeting standard in ELA will increase by 7% on SBA subsequently narrowing the achievement gap. Additionally, BMS students on free and reduced lunch will grow from level 2 to 3 on the January and May screenings.

Selected Classes Student Growth Measures

Areas of Focus will include student performance in 6th grade and 8th grade. Teachers will identify a sub group of students below standard. Students in this sub group will make additional growth relative to peers based on STAR, SBA, and conferring data in order to close the achievement gap.

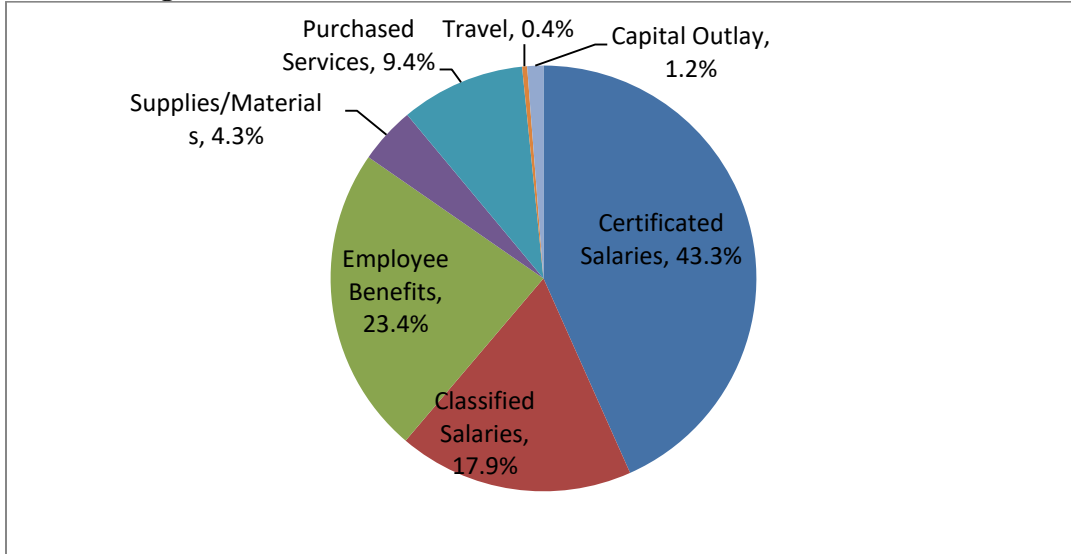
Invitation to Parents
